












Near this small Tablet erected by his



 and true Christian Simplicity.
 He devoted all his Time and Address
 either to the INSTRUCTIONS of YOUTH
 in elegant Learning and solid VIRTUES
 or to the Improvement of the Congregation committed under his Care
 (among whom he was greatly beloved and respected)
 in the Knowledge and Practice of those Christian Duties
 of which himself at the same time gave a bright Example.
 He continued thus at an early Age
 with incessant Labours of the PULPIT and the SCHOOL.
 in the faithful Service of his God and Fellow Creatures
 in our way of well doing but sacrificing Health to Duty.
 He departed hence after a painful and lingering Illness
 to receive the Reward of his virtuous Life.

THE CELEBRATED KENTISH CRICKETER.
THIS TABLET IS PLACED BY HIS SORROWING WIDOW
AND HIS MANY FRIENDS IN KENT.
HE PLAYED FOR ENGLAND AT HOME IN AUSTRALIA AND SOUTH AFRICA.
HE WAS THE MAINSTAY OF THE KENT XI FROM 1899 TO 1914
IN SEPTEMBER 1914 HE VOLUNTEERED AND WAS
ENROLLED IN THE KENT FORTRESS ENGINEERS
AND IN A SHORT TIME PROMOTED TO BE SERGEANT
IN 1917 HE WAS TRANSFERRED TO THE KING'S OWN YORKSHIRE
LIGHT INFANTRY AND FELL IN ACTION AT YPRES 8 NOV 1917 AT 38
AS CRICKETER - SOLDIER - PATRIOT
HE PLAYED THE GAME
"GLORIFY GOD IN YOUR BODY."
