What is an ONLINE SERVICE? NOT just a repeat of what would have been in church! Here's a look at how our YouTube services have evolved from a sudden beginning 12 months ago, and where we hope to go next.



Sunday Service - 22nd March 2020

Sudden lockdown! A pared-down service filmed in church, from the balcony, brings a slight feel of normality.



No access to churches! We move into people's gardens, studies and living rooms. Suddenly it's all more intimate. But the message gets through. All credit to the audio-visual team, blending all this together for a seamless YouTube broadcast!

Spring and Summer: services include interviews around the town; stories, animations, prayers outdoors; music from families, groups and soloists. Words are added on screen for the hymns.

July: Services in church resume, but YouTube viewings hold up.

September 2020: Major setback when an overloaded computer crashes on a Friday...

Can the service be put together? The team manages, and a new computer supports 4 cameras, bringing a sense of closeness and belonging to viewers who are housebound or scattered around the world.

Tonbridge and Malling Ramblers

welcomes new members this Spring

Members of Tonbridge and Malling Ramblers are preparing to stride out again when lockdown restrictions are eased. The Group will offer circular routes of around 5-6 miles each Sunday, often with

additional mid-week walks. The pace is moderate, about two miles an hour, allowing for hills, stiles and gates to be negotiated, as well as a half-way (bring your own) refreshment break.

During a year of stop-start rambling in 2020, the Group reformatted its walks (within Ramblers and government guidelines) by limiting each group of walkers to a maximum of nine. For popular walks, we had several groups starting at intervals, from the same location. The Kent countryside is always a bonus on our walks, which are usually within Tonbridge and Malling or neighbouring areas.

Neil Whittall (*pictured right*) leads the group and is supported by members who plan and lead walks, ensuring a variety of locations and terrain. Neil says "Feedback from members who walked with us in 2020 was very positive, thus confirming the benefits, for both mental and physical health, of getting out into the beautiful countryside, where we are fortunate to live".

Men's Walking Group

"Walking with the other guys has proved a real bonus" says Les Naylor. "The group started four years ago as a way of training to do the Three Peaks Challenge, which we completed in 2018. Since then we have walked the Pilgrims Way, from Winchester to Canterbury, and the Wealdway, from Gravesend to Eastbourne, in stages of 10 to 15 miles over a number of Saturdays. We have also had weekends away in the Yorkshire Dales and the Brecon Beacons.

In 'normal' times we meet on the first Saturday of the month and do a 5 to 6 hour walk. In the current lockdown, we are just walking in pairs each week, on shorter walks. The group has provided a great means of meeting up with non-church-goers, who share our enjoyment of walking. As we get to know them, we have opportunity not only to enjoy nature, but to talk about our faith and some of life's challenges".

Local Community



Kith 'n' Kin is a Community Interest Company (CIC) set up to support parents and carers whose child is violent and abusive to them. You may not have heard about this problem before.

Many parents and siblings suffer daily trauma, in silence, not knowing where to turn to for help, afraid of being judged and of the consequences. This silence can lead to lack of safety, social isolation, shame and mental health difficulties.

Kith 'n' Kin offers a two part programme of support, for parents, facilitated by qualified therapists. Initially tackling isolation by **bringing together these parents** to share experiences, support each other, learn de-escalation techniques, self-care and alternative parenting approaches, while having opportunities to **meet and talk** to helpful agencies, such as Police services, Domestic Abuse Charities, or CAMHS. Parents experience an increase in well-being, reduction in stress and an improvement in their relationship with their child. This leaves parents in a good position to embark on the second part of the programme, the Non Violent Resistance parenting programme, an approach developed by an Israeli family therapist, Haim Omer. He was inspired to help families where an aggressive or abusive young person did not want to have individual therapy, and parents were left unsupported. His model is based on the courageous and peaceful struggle against oppression and injustice, demonstrated by Ghandi and Mandela.

They achieved great things without resorting to violence. Non Violent Resistance parenting focuses on **re-building the parent child relationship, learning self-care, building a strong support network** for families and clear communication about what is acceptable. One of the NVR mottos is "Connection before Correction".

Starting locally, Kith 'n' Kin hopes to expand to offer wider regional support, developing in an organic way with contacts in schools, doctors' surgeries, youth groups, social services etc.

You may be familiar with the old fashioned phrase Kith and Kin meaning close friends/neighbours and family. We chose this name to express the value of solidarity between family and community, expressed in the African saying **'It takes a village to raise a child'**. If you would like to support us, or if you would like our support, we look forward to hearing from you.

Tonbridge Canoe Club



For many of us the best thing about living in and around Tonbridge is the river. Have you ever thought about just how different our town and the surrounding area might look from on the water rather than walking around?

Tonbridge Canoe Club has been based in the middle of the town since 1977. During the summer you can see us every Saturday morning messing around in front of the Castle or paddling up towards the Leigh Barrier or disappearing under Cannon Lane Bridge out into the countryside.

The club caters for all sorts of paddlers, from those who just enjoy an occasional paddle in the company of others to the tourer's who get out and about all over the country in normal times and the racers, both fast and not so fast, who enjoy keeping fit and competing in marathons and sprint events.

We run training courses during the summer, April to September, aiming to take a complete novice to being a safe and competent paddler capable of getting out on the river safely. During 2020, between lockdowns, we trained some 60 plus novices from 12 to 79 years of age!

THE BIGGER PICTURE

I have a photograph of my son's first Easter. It shows a 3-week-old baby in a car seat placed beneath a large wooden Cross adorned with fresh flowers.

A picture of serenity and new life - the baby sleeping beneath the bright spring colours of freshly cut flowers. However, this captured moment only tells part of the story. I am sure many families will treasure those picture-perfect moments, but if you expand the frame a couple of hours either way the story is something quite different! Now the picture includes the struggle of getting a new-born ready to leave the house, the sleepless nights and the colic.

The Cross in this picture also showed only part of its story; this Cross was heavy, was wooden with splinters, this Cross had been carried by several people a few days before on Good Friday for a solemn procession through the high-street. This Cross had stood bare and alone on Easter Saturday before being decorated by many hands representing new life in flowers. The Cross represents the events that had happened at Calvary some 2000 years before.

This past year from Easter to Easter we have experienced life like never before. We have each had a Covid journey experience. The pandemic has shaped many individual stories within the bigger picture of the whole world's experience. Some stories we have seen and shared, and others have been very personal.

On that first Easter the Bible tells us of the experiences of some who were with Jesus, some who had walked through His 3-year ministry with Him, seen Him perform miracles, seen Him be put to trial, seen Him die, the suffering of His own mother who loved Him dearly and the cold rejection of those who hated Him.

We can only see part of the picture, we can only sense part of the emotions felt. Still, these accounts invite us into an event which changed the world, an event which changed individual lives and still does daily, an event which shows us how much God loved this broken world and still does, an event which tells us that God loves each of us so much that He sent His only Son to die for us.

When I think back to that first Easter for my son, I am reminded that the Jesus, who rose again that first Easter, whose new life was represented on that Cross in flowers, knew of our struggles, knew of the realities of life and longed to walk with this little individual and his family through them all.

This is an invitation for all, an invitation into something so amazing, so life changing from a God who longs to transform lives.

50 start school in Kondoa, Tanzania

From the initial vision of a Pre-Primary and Primary School in Kondoa in 1999, the project has come a long way!

Funding from St. Peter & St. Paul Parish, Tonbridge began in 2013, with the fence built and first bricks made in 2014. Bishop James Longstaff, from Rochester Diocese, joined Bishop Given Gaula, of Kondoa, to lay the foundation stones in August, 2016. The School was officially opened in October 2018, with lessons for the thirty pupils commencing in early 2019. That year seventeen young people and leaders from our Tonbridge Parish visited to teach our Holiday Club themes to the Kondoa School children.

The School consists of six classrooms, an administration block, a Head-Teacher's House and an unfinished dormitory block. There are three English -speaking teachers, Head-Teacher

Conjester Benjamin, Teachers Careem and Emabrenda; plus a Swahili Teacher, Melina.

The School is part of Kor the Anglican Diocese of Kondoa, and is unique in that it is English and Swahili-speaking. There is a Christian ethos, in a

town where 80% are Muslim; yet the School will accept pupils of all faiths, rich or poor.

The Government Registration of the School met an unfortunate administration delay, but was finally achieved in early 2020, just before the COVID-19 pandemic began. Mercifully, the School has been able to function for most of 2020, with pupil numbers rising to about fifty. The financial impact of the COVID crisis on the poor Kondoa community has, however, been far greater. Many cannot afford the £300 per year school fee. An appeal has therefore been launched to support the School by providing half the school fee for

each child in 2021. With target numbers of sixty Standard One Primary and thirty Pre-Primary pupils, £13,500 needs to be raised. Happily, we were

able to send a first instalment of £7,000 (enough for 45 pupils) before Christmas and have hopes of raising the remainder required. Thank you all for your continued, generous support!

Bishop Given has begun construction of the Anglican Cathedral of Kondoa, St. Paul's, which will affirm the Christian mission and out-reach of the school.
