Life has been very hectic! Working extremely hard for almost three weeks I have been visiting rural villages for pastoral visits and confirmation services. I returned last night from visiting Kidoka Deanery, Mpendo Deanery, Bereko Deanery and I have been doing two services everyday. I was able to confirm 687 candidates. I laid foundation stone to five church and pastors' buildings. It has been a great encouragement to me to see the church is growing! I had to work hard and finish the confirmation trip for this year before I travel on Thursday to Ireland and the UK. I am happy that I only remained with the Cathedral Deanery and I will finish once I return on 7 November.

The Chemba project goes well. The builders were planning to roof two weeks ago but the engineer suggested building the timbers with cement on the walls before the iron sheets came on top! I asked the education board to go and see and they suggested the registration process can start. They have recommended Conjester to be used as the head of school because the one we were suggesting does not qualify for a secondary school but rather he qualifies for the primary school such as St Peter and St Paul School. Therefore Mr Muchila recommended using the name of Conjester to register the school. Mr Muchila is the board member of our Chemba Education Center and works for the government education department. Conjester has said it should be fine for her to start working to register the school. She just had a baby and she thinks next month she will be fine to start travelling. The good news nowadays is that registration is done online.

I am looking forward to seeing you in the UK when I visit St Peter and St Paul as I will have so many photos of Chemba Secondary School. Also St Peter and St Paul pre and primary School's today's graduation ceremony our children did a fantastic job and now everyone in Kondoa wants to bring their children to our school. It was well organized! I invited the District Commissioner to be the guest of Honor. And real St Peter and St Paul School has been a good investment for the gospel message in Kondoa. Many muslims a moving their children from Islamic school to St Peter. I praised Rahma a Muslim girl who did a very good presentation in English with great confidence as if she were a secondary School student. The DC said even a Secondary student cannot do a presentation as Rahma did today. Thank you very much for giving the mission of the Anglican Church to have good news to the community.
